CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS BEMIDJI, MINNESOTA

Regular Meeting - October 1, 2018

Pursuant to due call and notice, a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Bemidji, Beltrami County, Minnesota, was held on Monday, October 1, 2018 at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers of City Hall, Mayor Albrecht presiding.

Upon roll call, the following Councilmembers were declared present: Albrecht, Meehlhause, Hellquist, Johnson, Lehmann, Erickson, Larson.

AMENDMENTS TO AGENDA

Bemidji Youth Advisory Commission – No one appeared.

<u>Bemidji Strategic Alignment Initiative</u> – Dave Hengel, Greater Bemidji Executive Director, spoke about an alignment initiative of four organizations including Greater Bemidji, Visit Bemidji, Chamber of Commerce and Bemidji Downtown Alliance. This alignment would help to focus on working together and partnering on shared goals. However, each organization will continue to function independently.

<u>Sister City Relationship – Filottrano Trip</u> – Gary Rozman, History Center Executive Director, spoke about his trip to Filottrano, Italy. He will continue to work on developing a Sister City Relationship by forming a community sister city committee with the guidance from Sister City International.

NEW BUSINESS

Conduct a Public Hearing on Proposed Assessment of Costs Associated with Lot Maintenance and Other Miscellaneous Work Done by the City on Private Property

Pursuant to published notice, a Public Hearing was held to receive input regarding Proposed Assessment of Costs Associated with Lot Maintenance and Other Miscellaneous Work Done by City on Private Property. Mayor Albrecht opened the Public Hearing at 6:59 p.m., hearing no comments the public hearing was closed.

Erickson questioned the cost associated to parcel number 80.00749.00 (vacant lot located on 29th Street NW) incurred from demolition of a hazardous building. Erickson would like to get clarification from the City Attorney in relation to tax forfeiture and the timing of certifying the cost to the county assessor.

Motion by Erickson, seconded by Meehlhause to approve the resolution with the removal of parcel number 80.00749.00 from the assessment roll. The process of adopting the assessment roll was discussed; thereupon, Erickson withdrew her motion.

RESOLUTION NO. 6181: Adopting Assessment Roll for Costs Associated with Lot Maintenance and Other Miscellaneous Work Done by the City on Private Property in 2018 with parcel number 80.00749.00 in the amount of \$8,839.20 being contingent upon review by the city attorney was offered by Councilmember Erickson who moved its adoption, and upon due second by Councilmember Meehlhause passed by the following vote: Ayes: Albrecht, Meehlhause, Hellquist, Johnson, Lehmann, Erickson, Larson. Nayes: None.

Lake Irving Phosphorus Treatment Recommendation and Approval to Apply for Grants

Gray summarized the Lake Irving Phosphorus Treatment Feasibility Report prepared by Howard R Green and the recommended alternatives. As part of the 2019 MS4 permitting process, the City will need to demonstrate the treatment of phosphorus in that application. The proposed project would be conducted within the ditch that runs through the City's Rako Street property, which drains directly into Lake Irving. Of the four alternatives, Gray recommends Alternative 2 which shows an estimated load reduction of 221 pounds of phosphorus per year. Due to the partnership with the Mississippi Headwaters Board (MHB) and the Beltrami County Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) it is possible the City could have very little financial participation with the project, however, there will be future maintenance costs. The SWCD has agreed to be the fiscal agent for the grant, with MHB applying for the grant. MHB also stated that Enbridge Energy would pay for the 20% match if a grant is awarded. The city would become the owner of the project once completed. Council noted that due to the City's MS4 designation, the city is under higher standards for treating contaminants, however, all citizens should take part in keeping our rivers and lakes clean.

Motion by Erickson, seconded by Meehlhause approving Alternative 2 and authorizing the SWCD and MHB to apply for grants for the project. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

Resolution Authorizing Feasibility Study for 2019 Street Renewal Project – City Project 19-01 Sam Anderson, Assistant City Engineer, summarized the results of 10 years of the annual street renewal project and provided a proposed list of 2019 streets to be included in a feasibility study:

Pershing Avenue 1st Street East – 3rd Street SE 8th Street NE Bemidji Avenue – Lake Blvd Dewey Avenue Scott Avenue – Grant Avenue

Gemmel Avenue Paul Bunyan Drive – Cul de Sac (end)

McKinley Avenue 3rd Street SE – 4th Street SE

Anderson stated that the feasibility report is the first step in the Chapter 429 assessment process and will outline the proposed improvements, project costs, preliminary assessments and the feasibility of the proposed project. The Council will review the report in December and staff will hold a neighborhood meeting to outline the proposed project to the affected property owners.

RESOLUTION NO. 6182: Authorizing Feasibility Study for 2019 Street Renewal Project – City Project 19-01 was offered by Councilmember Meehlhause who moved its adoption, and upon due second by Councilmember Erickson, was passed by unanimous vote.

Approval of Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Transition Plan – City Project 18-08
Anderson stated that the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has enacted a requirement that all local agencies with greater than 50 employees, who are scheduled to receive federal funding in the 2019-2022 State Transportation Improvement Plan (STIP), must develop and adopt an Americans with Disabilities (ADA) Transition Plan. If this plan is not adopted, the city risks losing federal funding for their transportation projects. The City is scheduled to receive \$860,000 of federal funding in 2019 for the 30th Street and Hannah Avenue project. The ADA transition plan includes 44.5 miles of sidewalks and trails that are not compliant. The plan is to update these facilities as part of the annual street reconstruction program.

Motion by Meehlhause, seconded by Johnson to Approve the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Transition Plan - City Project #18-08. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

Authorizing Engineering and Design Services for 2019 Federal Aid Street Project for the Reconstruction of 30th Street and Hannah Avenue – City Project 19-02

Gray stated that \$860,000 of federal highway funding will be available in 2019 to complete the remainder of the reconstruction work on 30th Street and a project on Hannah Avenue. The proposed project will be a continuation of the 2015 project that narrowed 30th Street and added a 10 foot trail on the north side of the road. This would complete 30th Street, pick up the project at Ridgeway Avenue and continue to Hannah Avenue. They will also be looking at narrowing Hannah Avenue from 30th Street to Paul Bunyan Drive to include a sidewalk.

Motion by Lehmann, seconded by Erickson, authorizing the city engineer to begin project development and design work on the 2019 Anne Street and Hannah Avenue Reconstruction Projects – City Project 19-02. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

Write-Off of Loan Fund Balance with Wayzata Hospitality

In 2014, Council approved a \$400,000 loan to Wayzata Hospitality to construct a connecting link between the Sanford Center and Country Inn & Suites Hotel. The link was completed and the construction accepted by the City. Since that time, Wayzata Hospitality has been through a foreclosure action and the court has approved the sale of the hotel to a third party, free and clear of any junior liens, such as this loan. Staff does not recommend pursuing any further action to recoup this money and seeks council direction to write-off the remaining loan balance of \$332,416.67 and accrued interest from Wayzata Hospitality. Erickson stated that while this bad debt is unfortunate, the city did receive value in the link being constructed.

Motion by Erickson, seconded by Johnson, authorizing the write-off of the remaining loan balance of \$332,416.67 and accrued interest from Wayzata Hospitality effective September 30, 2018. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

The Bemidji Police Department has an opportunity to enter into a joint powers agreement with the Minnesota BCA to help support financial crime investigations in our area. These crimes are becoming increasingly complex and can involve multiple jurisdictions.

This JPA will assist our agency during financial crime investigations by providing wage and overtime wage reimbursement up to \$50,000, training and equipment for qualifying investigations.

STATE OF MINNESOTA FINANCIAL CRIMES TASK FORCE MULTIPLE-AGENCY LAW ENFORCEMENT JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT

This Multiple-Agency Law Enforcement Joint Powers Agreement, and amendments and supplements thereto, ("Agreement") is between the State of Minnesota, acting through its Commissioner of Public Safety on behalf of the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension ("State" or "BCA"), empowered to enter into this Agreement pursuant to Minnesota Statutes § 471.59, subdivisions 10 and 12, and City of Bemidji acting on behalf of its Police Department, 613 Minnesota Ave NW, Bemidji, MN 56601 ("Governmental Unit"), empowered to enter into this Agreement pursuant to Minnesota Statutes § 471.59, subdivision 10.

WHEREAS, the Governmental Unit wishes to participate in the Minnesota Financial Crimes Task Force ("MNFCTF") established to investigate and prosecute identity theft and related financial crimes;

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. Term

- **1.1 Effective Date.** This Agreement is effective on the date State obtains all required signatures pursuant to Minnesota Statutes § 16C.05, subdivision 2.
- **1.2 Expiration Date.** This Agreement expires five (5) years from the Effective Date unless terminated earlier pursuant to clause 12.

2. Purpose

The Governmental Unit approves, authorizes, and enters into this Agreement with the purpose of implementing a three-pronged approach to combat financial crimes: **prevention**, **education** and **enforcement**.

3. Standards

The Governmental Unit will adhere to the Minnesota Financial Crimes Task Force Standards identified below:

- **3.1** Provide and assign only licensed peace officers for services pursuant to this Agreement.
- Investigate major financial crimes by organized groups or individuals related to identity theft, e.g. bank fraud, wire fraud, access device fraud, commercial fraud, retail fraud and other similar economically-related forms of fraud (as defined in Minnesota Statutes § 609.52).
- **3.3** Prepare an investigative plan for each case assigned which will include: the identification of witnesses and witness statements; and obtaining and analyzing appropriate bank and business records.
- **3.4** Prepare a case synopsis which will include witness lists and relevant evidence for presentation to state and/or federal prosecutors for prosecution.
- 3.5 Comply with state and/or federal laws in obtaining arrest warrants, search warrants and civil and criminal forfeitures including compliance with proper legal procedures in securing evidence and, when applicable, recovery of computers.
- **3.6** Understand and use appropriate legal procedures in the handling of informants including documentation of identity, monitoring of activities, use and recordation of payments.

- **3.7** Use, as appropriate, a comprehensive portfolio of investigative technologies and techniques including surveillance, covert technologies and undercover assignments.
- **3.8** Interview and prepare reports on the victims of financial crimes, directing those victims to appropriate public and private resources to assist them in the recovery of their identities.
- 3.9 Investigate cases involving cross-jurisdictional and/or organized financial crime and high value theft schemes. [Note: An assignment may require travel throughout Greater Minnesota in addition to the seven county metropolitan area as investigations expand or as assigned by the task force commander.]

4. Responsibilities of the Governmental Unit and the BCA

- **4.1** The Governmental Unit will:
 - **4.1.1** Conduct investigations in accordance with provisions of the Minnesota Financial Crimes Task Force Standards, identified in clause 3 above, and conclude such investigations in a timely manner.
 - **4.1.2** Maintain accurate records pertaining to prevention, education, and enforcement activities, to be collected and forwarded quarterly to the MNFCTF Commander, or the Commander's designee, for statistical reporting purposes.
 - 4.1.3 Assign one or more employees of the Governmental Unit as members to the MNFCTF. All employees of the Governmental Unit assigned as members, and while performing MNFCTF assignments, shall continue to be employed and directly supervised by the same Governmental Unit currently employing that member. All services, duties, acts or omissions performed by the MNFCTF member will be within the course and duty of the member's employment and therefore covered by the Workers Compensation and other compensation programs of the Governmental Unit including fringe benefits.
 - **4.1.4** Make a reasonable good faith attempt to be represented at all scheduled MNFCTF meetings in order to share information and resources among the MN FCTF members.
 - **4.1.5** Participate fully in any audits required by the Minnesota Financial Crimes Task Force.
- 4.2 The parties mutually agree that any investigators assigned to the MNFCTF by the Governmental Unit will be provided an undercover vehicle and basic equipment, e.g. gun, handcuffs, vest, etc., by the Governmental Unit.
- **4.3** Nothing in this Agreement shall otherwise limit the jurisdiction, powers, and responsibilities normally possessed by a member as an employee of the Governmental Unit.

5. Reimbursement Requests and Payments

- **5.1** Upon the Effective Date of this Agreement, the Governmental Unit will be entitled to reimbursements in accordance with clause 5.3.
- 5.2 The Governmental Unit will submit a written request to the MNFCTF Commander prior to receiving a reimbursement from the BCA in accordance with clause 5.3. All requests will be submitted using the **Financial Crimes Task Force Outside Agency Reimbursement** form which will be provided by the BCA upon request from the Governmental Unit.
- 5.3 The Governmental Unit will only be reimbursed by the BCA for the following expenses which must be **pre-approved** by the MNFCTF Commander: 1) overtime salary including fringe benefits; 2) equipment; 3) training and training-related expenses directly incurred and relating to performance of MNFCTF assignments.
- **5.4** Reimbursement by the BCA to the Governmental Unit will be made until all designated member funds have been expended.
- **5.5** BCA shall reimburse Governmental Unit an amount not to exceed Fifty Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$50,000.00) during the Term of this Agreement.
- 5.6 The Governmental Unit shall submit original receipts when seeking reimbursement on preapproved requests. Approved reimbursements will be paid directly by the BCA to the Governmental Unit within thirty (30) days after the BCA receives reimbursement request. Reimbursement to the Governmental Unit will be paid to Bemidji Police Department, 613 Minnesota Ave NW, Bemidji, MN 56601.

7. Assignment, Amendments, Waiver, and Agreement Complete

7.1 Assignment. The Governmental Unit may neither assign nor transfer any rights or obligations under this Agreement.

- **7.2** Amendments. Any amendment to this Agreement must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved the original Agreement, or their successors in office.
- **7.3 Waiver.** If the State fails to enforce any provision of this Agreement, that failure does not waive the provision or its right to enforce it.
- **7.4** Agreement Complete. This Agreement contains all negotiations and agreements between the BCA and the Governmental Unit. No other understanding regarding this Agreement, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either party.

8. Liability

The BCA and the Governmental Unit agree each party will be responsible for its own acts and the results thereof to the extent authorized by law and shall not be responsible for the acts of any others and the results thereof. The BCA's liability shall be governed by provisions of the Minnesota Tort Claims Act, Minnesota Statutes § 3.736, and other applicable law. The Governmental Unit's liability shall be governed by provisions of the Municipal Tort Claims Act, Minnesota Statutes §§ 466.01-466.15, and other applicable law.

9. Audits

Under Minnesota Statutes § 16C.05, subdivision 5, the Governmental Unit's books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices relevant to this Agreement are subject to examination by the State and/or the State Auditor and/or Legislative Auditor, as appropriate, for a minimum of six (6) years from the end of this Agreement.

10. Government Data Practices

The Governmental Unit and the BCA must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minnesota Statutes Chapter 13, as it applies to all data provided by the BCA under this Agreement and as it applies to all data created, collected, received, stored, used, maintained, or disseminated by the Governmental Unit under this Agreement. The civil remedies of Minnesota Statutes § 13.08 apply to the release of the data referred to in this clause by either the Governmental Unit or the BCA.

If the Governmental Unit receives a request to release the data referred to in this clause, the

Governmental Unit must immediately notify the BCA. The BCA will give the Governmental Unit instructions concerning the release of the data to the requesting party before the data is released.

11. Venue

The venue for all legal proceedings out of this Agreement, or its breach, must be in the appropriate state or federal court with competent jurisdiction in Ramsey County, Minnesota.

12. Expiration and Termination

- **12.1** Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time, with or without cause, upon 30 days written notice to the other party. To the extent funds are available, the Governmental Unit shall receive reimbursement in accordance with the terms of this Agreement through the date of termination
- **12.2** Upon expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement, the Governmental Unit shall provide the MNFCTF Commander, in a timely manner, all investigative equipment that was acquired with funding received under this Agreement.

13. E-Verify Certification (In accordance with Minnesota Statutes § 16C.075)

For services valued in excess of \$50,000, the Governmental Unit certifies that as of the date of services performed on behalf of the BCA, the Governmental Unit and all its subcontractors will have implemented or be in the process of implementing the federal E-Verify program for all newly hired employees in the United States who will perform work on behalf of the BCA. The Governmental Unit is responsible for collecting all subcontractor certifications and may do so utilizing the E-Verify Subcontractor Certification Form available at

http://www.mmd.admin.state.mn.us/doc/EverifySubCertForm.doc. All subcontractor certifications must be kept on file with the Governmental Unit and made available to the BCA upon request.

Background:

The city recently completed the tenth year of our annual street reconstruction program on various streets within the city. The 2018 project consisted of the reconstruction and paving of the following street segments:

Bardwell Drive NW Anne Street Loop 1st Street to 4th Street Richards Avenue SE

24th Street NW Irvine Avenue to Bemidji Avenue 23rd Street NW Park Avenue to Irvine Avenue 14th Street NW Delton Avenue to Park Avenue

26th Street to 29th Street Minnesota Avenue

Exhibits A & A-1 are attached maps showing those segments.

Assessments to the benefitting properties are proposed for the work that was completed and therefore the project was undertaken as a Chapter 429 Special Assessment project. A public hearing was held on December 18th, 2017 and bids were awarded by the city council on February 20th, 2018. The city council now needs to hold an assessment hearing and consider the adoption of the final assessment roll which is attached. The city clerk has mailed a notice of the hearing to each property owner on the assessment roll.

<u>Assessments</u>

The proposed assessments for the 2018 project are the same as the previous nine years and according to the city's assessment policy are as follows:

\$38/lineal foot Street Assessments Sanitary Sewer Service Line \$1,070/ea. Water Service Line \$1,070/ea.

Bardwell Drive properties are proposed to be assessed a unit assessment of \$2,257 per lot. Corner lots with be assessed an amount of \$1,128. This is roughly 20% of the street costs divided up among the total number of lots within the project area.

Assessment Appeals

Each property owner that is proposed to be assessed has the ability to appeal their assessment amount to the city council at the assessment hearing. In order to appeal, the property must either submit a written notice of appeal prior to the assessment hearing or they may attend the hearing this evening.

We have received a written assessment appeal from Zach and Kara Frink, 2809 Minnesota Avenue, which is attached. Their parcel has been assessed according to the city's assessment policy. The lot has 153 feet of frontage on Minnesota Avenue and it was not assessed for any new utility services. Their total assessment is \$5,814.00. If a property owner appeals at the hearing and is not satisfied with the outcome they can then appeal to district court. A property owner cannot appeal to district court without first filing an appeal at the city's assessment hearing.

Finance

The total project cost ended up being \$1,676,483 and the assessments for the project total \$330,986 which is about 20% of the total project costs.

The city's share of the project is funded with the street property tax levy, the storm water utility fund and appropriate shares from the water and sanitary sewer utility funds. The assessments will be spread over a 15-year period with an interest rate of 3.50%.

Recommendation:

It is staff's opinion that each parcel on the assessment roll has benefitted from the project in an amount greater than or equal to the proposed assessment. It is recommended that the city council hold the assessment hearing and adopt the attached resolution approving the assessment roll for City Project 18-01.

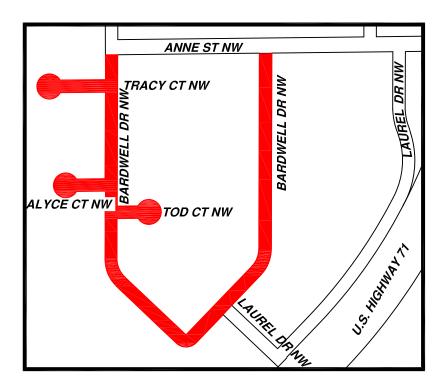

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING ASSESSMENT ROLLS FOR CITY PROJECT #18-01

WHEREAS, pursuant to proper notice duly given as required by law, the Council has met and heard and passed upon all objections to the proposed assessment for the costs associated with:

2018 STREET RENEWAL PROJECT

Bardwell Drive NW - Anne Street Loop Richards Avenue SE - 1st Street to 4th Street 24th Street NE - Irvine Avenue to Bemidji Avenue 23rd Street NW - Park Avenue to Irvine Avenue 14th Street NW - Delton Avenue to Park Avenue Minnesota Avenue - 26th Street to 29th Street

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF BEMIDJI, MINNESOTA:

- 1. Proposed Assessment Rolls for City Project No. 18-01, copy of which is on file in the City Clerk's Office, is hereby adopted and shall constitute a special assessment against the lands named therein, and each tract of land therein included is hereby found to be benefited by the improvement in the amount of the assessment levied against it.
- 2. Such assessments shall be payable in equal annual installments over an extended period of time as indicated in the individual Assessment Roll. The first of the installments are to be payable on or before the first Monday in January, 2019, and shall bear interest at the rate of 3.5 percent (3.5%) per annum. To the first installment shall be added interest on the entire assessment from first day of December 2018. To each subsequent installment when due shall be added interest for one year on all unpaid installments.
- 3. The owner of any property so assessed may, at any time prior to certification of the assessment to the County Auditor, pay the whole of the assessment on such property, with interest accrued to the date of payment, to the City Finance Director, except that no interest shall be charged if the entire assessment is paid within 30 days from the adoption of this resolution; and may, at any time thereafter, pay to the City Finance Director the entire amount of the assessment remaining unpaid, with interest accrued to December 31 of the year in which such payment is made. Such payment must be made before November 30 or interest will be charged through December 31 of the next succeeding year.
- 4. The City Clerk shall forthwith transmit a certified duplicate of the assessment rolls to the County Auditor to be extended on the property tax lists of the county. Such assessments shall be collected and paid over in the same manner as other municipal taxes.

Background

For the last three months, Manager Mathews, FRA Trustee Member Hellquist and Finance Director Eischens have been discussing the pension benefit with FRA officials. The current three-year understanding expires December 31, 2018.

On October 1st the Public Affairs Committee met to discuss this issue and the FRA proposal. Attached is the agenda item from this meeting.

Public Affairs Committee unanimously approved the recommendation for a benefit level increase to \$6,857, or 7%, effective January 1, 2019. In addition, there is a mutual understanding that future increases for 2020 and 2021 will be 7% annually, subject to annual review by both the FRA Trustees and the Public Affairs Committee.

Recommendation:

Public Affairs Committee recommends approval of FRA requested benefit level increase to \$6,857 effective January 1, 2019, including amending FRA by-laws reflecting this change (see attached). Pension benefit increases for 2020 and 2021 cannot be approved at this time but the understanding is 7% annual increases are reasonable pending annual review.

The current three-year understanding with the FRA regarding their pension benefit expires on December 31, 2018. Over the last several months, FRA Trustee member Hellquist and City staff discussed this and other issues with FRA officers.

The current pension benefit guaranteed by the City is \$6,408 per year of service. The FRA membership increased the benefit level to \$7,800 independently on September 25th to demonstrate their willingness to shoulder some financial risk. They believe their investment portfolio is able to safely grant this benefit increase and still withstand a significant stock market correction before the City would be liable to contribute to cover the guarantee.

A positive development is the FRA Trustee's decision to maintain a surplus position of 120%, versus the 105% stated in their By-Laws. This provides a cushion against future market downturns, minimizing the risk of a required City contribution.

Staff and FRA trustees believe it is in our joint interests to come to an agreement for the upcoming three-year period, years 2019 to 2021. The City is legally unable to approve a multi-year agreement regarding the pension benefit, but during our discussions, both sides are comfortable with a multi-year understanding, subject to annual review and approval, of the following:

Pension benefit increase:

- o 7% for 2019 \$6,857 per year of service
- o 7% for 2020 \$7,337 per year of service
- 7% for 2021 \$7,850 per year of service

Council approval of any pension benefit increase carries with it a "financial guarantee", meaning that if the FRA is unable to fund the pension benefit, the City is financially obligated to maintain the benefit level. This liability is amortized over ten years. The Rural Fire Association is also guaranteeing their portion of any pension shortfall through their contract for fire services with the City.

Recommendation:

Staff recommend approving the FRA request for a pension benefit increase of \$449, or 7%, to a level of \$6,857 per year of service, effective 1/1/2019 with an annual review thereafter. The multi-year <u>understanding</u> includes proposed future increases as follows:

- \$480, or 7%, effective 1/1/2020 for an annual benefit of \$7,337
- \$513, or 7%, effective 1/1/2021 for an annual benefit of \$7,850

Approving the above action plan provides staff direction and support to address FRA requests for pension increases in 2020 and 2021.

Council needs to approve the 2019 pension benefit level as it must be acted on for each increase.

Background

The Sanford Center has three boilers providing heat to the building. In mid-July staff informed Council of boiler problems related to faulty electronic control boards. At that time, Council approved replacement of these boards, making two of the boilers operational. However, the third boiler is still not functioning.

Both the City Building Inspector and Venuworks maintenance staff concur the nonoperational boiler should be replaced, starting a new warranty period. Quotes from local vendors to replace the boiler and 275 gallons of glycol are summarized below:

 Higgins Heating \$59,170 Peterson Sheet Metal \$59,351 Navlors \$59,961

Funding for this project can come from the capital replacement fund established for the Sanford Center, which currently has a balance of \$624,000. In the near future, a request to replace certain audio visual and maintenance equipment will be presented for Council consideration as well.

Recommendation:

Authorize replacement of one Sanford Center boiler including 275 gallons of glycol to the low quote from Higgins Heating for \$59,170 with funding from the Sanford Center capital replacement fund.

The West 208.74 feet of the East 538.74 feet of the Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter (SE¼ of SW½), Section Seven (7), Township One Hundred Forty-six (146), Range Thirty-three (33), less the West 100 feet of the East 538.74 feet of the South 203 feet and less the North 720 feet thereof, and less that part thereof conveyed to County of Beltrami as shown by microfilm no. 265789, and excepting county highway right of way.

Paragraph 2 of said Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows:

- 2. The City of Bemidji, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.036, that with respect to the property taxes payable on the area legally described herein, hereby annexed, shall make a cash payment to the Township of Bemidji in accordance with the following:
 - a. In the first year following the year in which the City of Bemidji could first levy on the annexed area, an amount equal to \$213.71 payable in one lump sum payment. A sum total of \$213.71 payable over a period of two years in two (2) equal annual installments, the first installment payable in the first year following the year in which the City of Bemidji could first levy on the annexed area.

The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to file a copy of this Ordinance with the Municipal Boundary Adjustment Unit of the Office of Administrative Hearings, the Minnesota Secretary of State, the Beltrami County Auditor, and the Township Clerk, and to take such actions and to provide such additional information as may be needed to achieve the purpose of this Ordinance.

All other provisions of Ordinance No. 151, 3rd Series, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect and final upon the date this Ordinance is approved by the Office of Administrative Hearings and due publication thereof.
